



## Summary of Social Distancing Measures for Shoreline Lake Camps

### *Arrival & Wellness Check*

Campers arriving by car will be directed to a drop off zone. A greeter will check each camper's temperature before they exit the vehicle – anyone with a fever of 100.4° F [38.0° C] or greater will not be allowed to be dropped off.

- On the first day of camp, each camper will be given a color-coded placard to place on the car dashboard for the remainder of the week, to identify their specific camp group.

Any camper arriving by bicycle, or otherwise transporting themselves to camp (with parental authorization), will be required to wait at a designated area for temperature screening.

Campers with symptoms of acute respiratory illness will not be allowed to join camp until they are free of fever (100.4° F [38.0° C] or greater), signs of a fever, and any other symptoms for at least 24 hours, without the use of fever-reducing or other symptom-altering medicines (e.g., cough suppressants).

- Symptoms may include, but are not limited to, fever, shortness of breath, cough, chills, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, loss of taste or smell.
- A longer waiting period may be required depending on the symptoms.
- At the discretion of management, parents may be asked to reschedule their child(ren) for a later week of camp.

If anyone in a camper's household has a confirmed case of COVID-19, this must be disclosed to Shoreline Lake management prior to drop off.

- To avoid exposing healthy families, anyone living in the same household as a person who tested positive for COVID-19 – and who has not been medically cleared – will be required to quarantine outside of Shoreline Lake premises.

### *Santa Clara County Shelter in Place Order*

To comply with current County guidelines please ensure your child is only attending at most one summer camp program every 3-week period. ### *Personal Protection & Equipment*

Campers and staff will be required to wear face coverings consistent with Santa Clara County guidelines (certain activities, such as windsurfing, where a face covering could pose a safety hazard, will be exempted from face coverings).

- Shoreline Lake does not provide face coverings (except gaiters for staff). Campers and staff are required to bring their own each day, and will be sent home if they do not have a face covering.
- Campers should pack a spare face covering in case their face covering becomes dirty or unusable during the day.





### *Personal Protection & Equipment (Cont.)*

Although staff must wear gloves for food safety and preparation purposes, wearing gloves (disposable or otherwise) is optional for campers, other than if required in specific sports for safety reasons. As such Shoreline Lake does not provide disposable gloves; however, campers may bring their own, if disposed of properly.

To have enough supply on hand for staff, Shoreline Lake requires all campers to bring a container of hand sanitizer – of a size and shape that can be easily stored with their belongings, placed in a pocket, hung from a lanyard, clipped to a loop, or similar.

Parents should ensure campers are applying sunscreen before arriving at Shoreline, and that campers pack adequate sunscreen to reapply as needed throughout the day (and understand how to apply it properly).

- Staff will not physically assist in reapplying sunscreen on campers: Staff will give reminders to reapply, and allow time for this, but will not assist campers.
- Parents may want to consider UPF clothing to reduce the need for sunscreen, particularly for campers who may have difficulty in applying their own sunscreen.
- Parents should keep in mind that campers may be outdoors for the entire day and provide sun protection accordingly.

All campers must bring a reusable water bottle. These can be refilled as needed throughout the day, but should be of adequate size to minimize the need for refills.

Campers will not be allowed to share items (sunscreen, water bottles, food, etc.) with one another.

### *Capacity & Maximum Enrollment*

Each camp program will be conducted with a maximum of 12 campers. Programs with enrollment exceeding this number shall be subdivided into groups of no more than 12 campers, and these subgroups will be maintained as separate camp programs for the duration of the week.

All camps will allow no more than 2 campers per boat, with the exception of canoes which will allow 3 due to their greater length. Exceptions may be made for safety considerations, such as a sailboat that may require 3 campers to prevent capsizing depending on weather conditions.

- Staff will be on board boats with campers as necessary to meet safety and instructional needs.
- Low-capacity camps (Beginner Sailing, Advanced Sailing), which are normally restricted by the amount of equipment available, have had their capacity reduced to be in line with this restriction.

### *Meals Distribution & Food Restrictions*

Camp lunches provided by Shoreline will be prepared as a single-serving bag or box lunch, rather than in a buffet style. As these will all be pre-packaged for pickup, please ensure any food allergies or dietary restrictions are communicated so that appropriate meals are prepared and identified properly.
