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Shoreline Lake Assists Paddle4Good in Relaunching Events for Disabled Youth

After long hiatus, PaddleTogether Program returns to Shoreline Lake on October 4 and 10, bringing together the disability, volunteer and paddling communities.

Mountain View, CA. September 23, 2026 – Shoreline Lake and Paddle4Good announced today that the Boathouse will host the relaunch of the PaddleTogether Program, which offers organized events providing a free, safe, and memorable half-day on the water for young people with disabilities. They also seek volunteers, of all ages, to take part in this unique outdoor experience and help create a meaningful day for all participants.

These inclusive events (scheduled for October 4th & 10th) welcome those of all abilities, and feature stand up paddling, kayaking and other on-the-water activities, along with lawn games and an awards ceremony. Events run from 9am-1pm for participants, and 8am-1:30pm for volunteers. There are no restrictions on participant disabilities (ages 4-24). Volunteers can join in the fun and lend a hand via three main groups (Buddies, Water Teams and the Support Team).

“Supporting Paddle4Good in relaunching their PaddleTogether events, and helping spread the word to potential volunteers, is a natural fit for us,” says Christina Ferrari, President of Silicon Shores Corporation (which operates Shoreline Lake). “This program also gives our visitors, including younger patrons, access to meaningful volunteering opportunities, even without prior experience.”

Organized by Santa Cruz-based nonprofit Paddle4Good, the events return to Shoreline Lake – the protected environment, gentle breezes, plethora of skilled watersports staff and enthusiasts, and experienced Events Team make it an ideal partner venue. And, with the founder’s twenty-five years of running these events throughout the country, Paddle4Good hopes to rebuild the program’s pre-pandemic momentum and continue connecting these diverse communities through volunteer mentoring programs and outreach.

“The PaddleTogether events are a win-win-win,” says Max Montgomery, Paddle4Good founder and Executive Director. “Besides benefiting these young people and volunteers, parents get a rare moment to see their child engage and interact with others, and just have fun. Although the pandemic and its aftereffects derailed these events, after an abundance of caution, we’re thrilled to finally bring back a program that involves the community serving the community.”
